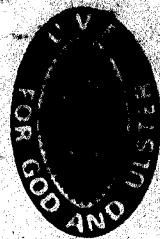

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SECTARIANISM

WHO STANDS TO GAIN ?

Sectarian violence is the most powerful and vicious weapon in the hands of the pro-Sunningdale politicians. Powerful, because it will justify the need for a Council of Ireland and Power Sharing Executive; and vicious, because it sets the ordinary rank and file Protestants and Papists at each others' throats.

The Unionist Fur Coat Brigade desperately wants to cling on to the power which it has exercised over the Ulster people since the inception of the State. The S.D.L.P. and the 'Castle' Catholics desperately want to consolidate their new found authority on the Power Sharing Executive. The major English political parties desperately want rid of the Ulster problem through some form of Irish dimension. The Fine Gael & Irish Labour Parties desperately require some form of settlement which will give them an excuse to satisfy the nationalistic aspirations of their supporters.

The Council of Ireland the the gerrymanded Northern Ireland Executive have been conjured-up by the above parties as a compromise whereby they all can feel satisfied and secure. The sorry aspect of this compromise is that it is acceptable to no one else other than themselves. Both the Republican Movement (Official & Provisional) and the Loyalist Movement are totally opposed to the Sunningdale Agreement, albeit for different reasons. Not only so, but the vast majority of the Ulster electorate have rejected the terms of Sunningdale.

The greatest danger to the implementation of the Sunningdale Agreement is the growing movement amongst the paramilitary organisations towards seeking a political solution. The Ulster Volunteer Force's call for the unity and sovereignty of the Ulster people within the United Kingdom is anathema to the pro-Sunningdale supporters. If the U.V.F. was to be successful in obtaining a peaceful solution whereby all sections of the community would work for the common good of Northern Ireland within the United Kingdom, then there would be no need for Sunningdale. Peace and contentment in Ulster at this time would sound the death knell for the Council of Ireland.

It is obvious then, and well does Faulkner and Fitz know it, that the Sunningdale Agreement is to be justified there must be an escalation of sectarian violence. The U.V.F. must be broken and the Provisional Alliance must be diverted away from bombing the City Centre and encouraged

to bomb loyalist working class areas. Recent sinister events have proved that those with vested interests in the Sunningdale Agreement have already embarked upon a campaign to foster sectarian strife throughout Northern Ireland. Civil war, between Protestant and Papist workers in Belfast and the Provincial towns would provide the opportunity which the pro-Sunningdale elements need to impose their undemocratic solutions upon the Ulster people.

The machine gun attack upon Protestant and Papist workers at Duncrue Street, the bombing of the Spa Bar in Spamount Street and the Cambridge Bar near Brougham Street; the Ormeau Road murders, followed by the Shankill Road murders and the Greencastle and Sandy Row explosions all point to the involvement of 'hired mercenaries' working under the direction of the faceless degenerates who urgently require a renewed spate of sectarian violence.

The pattern is clear. The killings and explosions are deliberate, cold-blooded, planned and calculated to create the impression on Papists that their attackers are Protestants, and on Protestants that they are being murdered by Papists. Carefully gauging the effects of their actions, the agents of the pro-Sunningdale supporters, send their mercenaries into Protestant and Papist areas with the intention of fomenting widespread sectarian violence.

Anyone who assists, in any way, or who promotes, advocates or condones sectarian violence is playing into the hands of the Sunningdale Supporters. This is not to say, of course, that we should be diverted from smashing the Provisional IRA terrorist machine. So long as the Provisional Alliance is determined to shoot and bomb their way to a United Ireland, then we, as loyalist patriots must be prepared to pursue a strong military policy of defence and retaliation. We must, however, be very careful to select our targets so that the world will see that our activities are being directed against the right people and for the right reasons. Let us not allow ourselves to become the tools of the Republican Unionist Alliance and their cohorts at Westminster and Dublin.

REMEMBER; whoever stands to gain from sectarianism, it will not be the ordinary rank and file from the streets of Belfast or the farmers and factory workers of the country towns. They will be the victims, and no sham sectarian victory will change the verdict of society for them.

COMBAT The violence of the Provisional IRA; the senseless bombings, murders, and mutilations

COMBAT The violence of the Security Forces; the dawn swoops, the wrecked homes, the Kitsonian torture, the distraught wives and the heartbroken mothers.

COMBAT The violence of bad housing and no housing; the overcrowding of homes, the high rise flats, the damp walls, the high rents and the rapacious landlords.

COMBAT The violence of sectarianism; the division of a community for political gain, the murder of citizens on account of their religion, and the paid sectarian mercenaries of the upper-middle class Tories.

Loyalists of Ulster, hearken to the sound of an alarm and combat the enemies of your beloved Province. The enemies who employ physical violence and those who employ institutionalised violence — the illegal violence and the 'legal' violence.

Let us rise together and make for our Province a new era of peace, contentment and good government—

I am, therefore appalled at the decision of the Community Relations Department to cancel their invitation for Mr. Bleakley to attend the opening of the Ballymacarrett Walkway.
